Educating and protecting from childhood sexual abuse

Monster Hunt is a board game created to educate and protect kids from childhood sexual abuse. The game focuses on perpetrators known to the family; ones that rarely use force, but rather, they use emotional coercion, manipulation, or bribes.

The beginner's booklet educates the children on basic body safety guides them in creating a safety network from amongst their caregivers.

Once the game begins, the child plays together with their primary caregiver to capture "monsters", and make friends. The right choices enable the caregiver to capture the monster, while a wrong answer leads to a toy being confiscated – a classic reward-and-punishment approach.

As the child plays along, they identify their own body security, understand the signs of an abuser, and are provided with the tools needed to stay safe.

Monster Hunt is an initiative to empower children globally. It is an engaging and playful method of self-protection.
